 - c) Which section contains images of museum objects? *Objects* /1

3. This quiz will focus on museum objects. Go to the Objects section. Click on the Arctic region of the map. Scroll down through the artifact pictures.
 - a) Name an object that was used for fishing. *Harpoon head* /1
 - b) What three materials is this object made from?
Chipped stone, bone and sinew /1
 - c) Click on the magnifying glass. What do you see? *An enlarged photo of the object* /1
 - d) Select "Detailed description" beneath the photo and look at its artifact record. Name one type of information on this record. *Artifact number, cultural affiliation, place of use, size* /1

4. Return to the map.
 - a) Select the Plains region. Find a beaded rawhide pouch that was worn as part of a dancing outfit. When was this pouch made? *Between 1964 and 1974* /1
 - b) Select the Western Subarctic region. What is the artifact number of the birch bark berry basket?

 - c) Choose the Plateau region and look for a saddle. From what materials is it made?
Wood, rawhide, sinew /1
 - d) In the Pacific Coast region, name an object that had a lost twin in Paris.

- e) Select the Woodlands and Eastern Subarctic region. "The man who wore this painted caribou-skin coat may have done so to propitiate and honour the spirit of the caribou he sought to kill." To which semi-nomadic group did the owner belong? *Naskapi* /1

5. Besides the map, objects can be searched by Object type from the menu on the left side of the Objects page. Select Object type and look at the list of object categories.
- a) In which category would you find a harpoon? *Fishing and trapping* /1
- b) In which category would you find a kayak? *Transportation (water)* /1
6. Go to the Sports category.
- a) How many objects are in this collection? *23* /1
- b) Which is the most modern object in the collection? *Baseball hat* /1
- c) What other objects are in this collection? Name three.

7. Select New Search from the bottom left corner. In the Keywords box, type "tipi".
- a) Which object comes from the Slavey people? *Tipi frame* /1
- b) Find the Abenaki tipi. Select its image to see a close-up and select its object name to see the artifact record. How big is it? *Height 4.8 cm, Outside Diameter 9.1 cm* /1
- c) Which category do you think this appears in? *Dwellings* /1
8. Now, go to the Dwellings category.
- a) Name four different types of shelters represented by the objects.
Four of: tipi, sweat lodge, tent, house, lodge, wigwam, winter house, igloo /1
- b) Find a Kwakiutl pole, object VII-E-391. How many figures are depicted on the pole? *4* /1
- c) Which province did this pole come from? *British Columbia* /1
9. Head to the Clothing and Accessories category. Scroll through the pages.
- a) How do you think the objects are organized?
Grouped by region and culture area /1
- b) How many objects are in this category? *over 1,700* /1
- c) Search for a vest from the Plains region. How many did you find? *8* /1
- d) Look for the vest with the least beading. What is its artifact number? *V-X-539* /1

10. Go to the Transportation (Land) category. Look for a cradle-board, artifact number III-D-711, used to carry a baby.
- a) What modern object does it resemble? *Baby backpack* /1
 - b) How did someone wear it? Select the artifact name and look at the photo at the bottom of the page for a clue.
