


Match the Object to the Material Teachers's Answer Sheet

Additional information for teachers:

Man's parka, artifact IV-C-1745 (Netsilingmiut) Man's parka, of grey-brown and white caribou skin.

Spear ornament II-A-7

(Ktunaxa, Kootenay) This spear decoration is made of a long piece of coloured cotton cloth with 22 highly prized eagle tail feathers along one edge. **Moccasins**, artifact V-C-207 a-b (Nakoda) These plain buckskin moccasins are made from tanned and smoked skin in a two-piece construction.

Storage box, artifact VII-B-324 a,b (Haida) This cedar storage box has four sides that are made from a single hand made board.

Boot, artifact VI-E-56

(Dogrib) Boot made of cloth, smoked moose hide, and alternated dark-blue and red wool fabric. The apron and the upper boot are decorated with beads.

Rattle, artifact VII-X-1276 c (Nuu-chah-nulth, Nootka) Part of a dance set, this shell rattle is made from five pierced shells and shredded cedar bark strung on a wire hoop.
